1. Call to order/roll call

9. Update on Possible Donation of Post Office

Numerous questions were posed over the financial responsibility and liability potential of acquiring/accepting the "donation" of the Post Office is in the best interest of GWHS. Suggestions include subdividing it or renting out the back part of the building. More information is needed before a decision can be made on this commitment.

10.Update on Putt Putt Donation and ATCS Tracking system- Rick

The Putt- Putt is being stored for the winter by Chris Kivie. It was owned by Great Northern. Rick initiated conversation about the possibilities of coordinating with the Duluth and Spooner Depots, recreating a shed the Putt-Putt can be stored in, linking it to the Cleo sites and the Soo Line Historical site. We talked about putting it on an aution site as a fundraiser. Rick will continue to explore costs for the shed and renovating the Putt-Putt. The ATCS Tracking system is back up and running. Discussion ensued about incorporating the ATCS system with the GWHS to be.

11.Update on Trading Post Project, WHS State Conference, and NW Consortium meetings- Jan

Jan attended the Northwest Consortium in Birchwood to talk about planning coordinated events. They discussed a variety of topics to include Native Americans.

Jan attended the Wisconsin Historical Society meeting in Rothchild where they offered courses on tourism, and presented many ideas on promoting tourism. They offer monthly history chats via zoom with a year planned out at a time. This has encouraged our organization to attempt to consider the same idea of planning out events throughout the year on a calendar on our website. It would include events as our walking tours, cemetery tours, etc. Jan also applied for a \$7000 grant aimed at projects to persevere history during the 1600-1800 time periods. 12.Other Business

Rick discussed two other shelving unit, one about 63 inches tall and 13 inches deep and the other about 5 ft by 38 inches and 18 inches deep, both available that would work well in the Whalen House.

Rick and Tay also put together a list of about 10 different ideas/topics for presentation. The subjects included Ricing, Botany, Logging, and other industry here. Evidently Gordon was referred to as "Medicine Country" because of the number of plants that grew here naturally and were used medicinally.
